

# **Nova Bus FAQ**

### 1. Why is TheRide getting replacement buses?

Due to FTA regulations, ¼ of our fleet was past its useful life, therefore ordering new buses is required

#### 2. What brand are the replacement buses?

The new buses are manufactured by Nova, and are made in the USA (Plattsburgh, NY)

### 3. How many buses is TheRide replacing?

TheRide is getting 8 total buses in FY2021. The contract requires a minimum of five years, with five buses per year.

### 4. How long does a bus last?

12 years/500,000 miles.

### 5. How many miles does a bus travel in a year?

On average, approximately 42,000/year.

### 6. How many miles does a bus travel in its lifetime?

On average, approximately 450,000-500,000 miles in its lifetime.

#### 7. How much does one bus cost?

Each bus costs approximately \$510,507.

## 8. What is the source of funding for the buses?

TheRide is using Federal Funding for the purchase of the new buses.

### 9. Why couldn't the funding be used to bring back more service?

The Federal Funding is specifically for purchasing capital equipment, like buses. It cannot be used for operating purposes.

#### 10. What is different about the Nova buses than what we currently have?

There are many additional features to these buses, such as:

- Larger windows
- Larger front door for easier entry
- Seating is more comfortable, configured differently
- More floor markings
- The body of the bus
- Collision avoidance system (system that helps drivers avoid pedestrians, bicyclists, cars nearby)

### 11. Why did we choose these buses over what we currently have?

We wanted to improve the rider experience.

#### 12. How do these compare to hybrid buses in terms of emissions?

With new engineering and the improvements on the emissions systems these are comparable if not better than the hybrids.



## 13. Do these replace the hybrids?

The new fleet will replace some of the hybrid buses.

## 14. Were electric or hybrid buses considered? If not, why not?

Hybrids are more expensive to maintain.

## 15. Why is there a new exterior design?

We are returning to our traditional branding that reflects the colors in our logo (red, white, and blue). We wanted to allow for a cleaner design. The simpler design makes it easier to repair.
